## Double silver for Waterloo synchro at nationals

(May 30, 2007)

Waterloo Regional Synchro's Tier 6 and 7 swimmers finished the season with a bang at the Canadian Espoir National Championships in St. John, N.B.

Improving on their fourth-place finish last season, the select team captured the silver medal in the Tier 6/7 select team event.

Members of the team were Jillian Boa, Reilly Coombs, Rachel Demmers, Krissy Einboden, Aileen Hodgson, Renee Hoegy, Christine Horner, Ellyn Klea, Erin Noll and Emily Verbiski.

Boa also captured a silver medal for her individual figures performance in a field of 110 swimmers.

Her teammates in the 16-and-over competition featured Klea who finished 17th, Coombs who finished 20th and Noll who finished 34th.

It was fierce competition in the 15- and-under figure category featuring 183 swimmers.

Waterloo Regional swimmers had some strong result including Demmers finishing 52nd, Verbiski 60th, Horner 68th, Einboden 73rd and Hodgson 78th.

As the only swimmer for Waterloo Regional Synchro in the Tier 7 figure event, Hoegy swam a personal best and came home with a sixth-place finish.

Back in the routine competition, combo swimmers Boa, Mallory Burt, Coombs, Demmers, Einboden, Hodgson, Hoegy, Horner, Klea, Noll, and Verbiski helped Waterloo Regional Synchro achieve its first national podium placing with a sixth in the free routine combination. Boa and Verbiski teamed up in the 16-and-over duet event where they captured yet another podium placing for Waterloo Regional Synchro with a fourth place finish out of 24 routines from across Canada.

Waterloo Regional Synchro also had two strong finishes in the 16-and-over solo event.

A total of 27 routines from across Canada qualified to compete at this year's national championships.
